**WE'VE MOVED !!!**

At the 2000/01 Annual General Meeting of SCC on Tuesday, Sept. 12, at Wexford Collegiate Institute, the high school we have called home for many years now, the members decided to move the club that Friday to the Wexford Seniors' Apartments ( Community Centre ), 1860 Lawrence Ave. East, just east of Pharmacy. We are most grateful to the management of the centre for their generous offer of free space. When the Toronto School Board harmonized its' schools' permit policy due to amalgamation, the new rental cost for us increased a staggering amount. We, like many non-profit community groups who have called high school gyms and cafeterias home for many years, were forced to find new premises. It is the most fortunate good luck that the new location is only 5 min. from the high school, and that ready TTC access is still available. As well, you will note, we have a new web site address for this 2000/01 club year.

The move went smoothly, and SCC's normal activities were not even interrupted. Thanks to those who helped in the move. Our Fall ( Sun. ) Swiss'00 started in the new location on that Sunday, and the 5-min. blitz tournament, open to non-members, was offered as usual.

We started the club year with 100 members, and I guess one could say the new location is “ cozy “. It handles nearly all the normal SCC activities : the turnout average we get for our multi-week swiss and round-robin tournaments on Thurs. and Sun.; the “ open “ 15 min. ( Tues. ) and 5 min. blitz ( Sun. ) tournaments we offer; and our monthly SCC youth tournaments.

All in all, SCC has burst out of the starting gate this fall. The new executive is initiating a 3-prong membership drive. We have 33 players for the Thurs. Swiss and 30 for the Sunday Swiss, continuing the average we had last year. We will be fielding 2 teams for the new GTA team league. It looks like an exciting year ahead !!

## **SCC Actives for 2000/01**

Our “ open “ club-run Active tournaments will require larger space than the new room we use. But there may be the possibility of use of a larger room in the community centre on these occasions, and the exec. is looking into this. If this is not possible, then external space will be rented by SCC for the Actives, and the location will be well-advertised once settled upon. Our first Active is Sunday, Nov. 5. Mark it in your calendar!! The flyer with details is currently in the works, and will come out in the next few days. Since it is going to be our “ inaugural “ Active, in terms of living in our new premises, look for the special “ inaugural “ one-time prize structure SCC will offer with this Nov. Active.

In Issue # 1, we gave you the amazing game by Bobby Fischer involving a Q-sac. Here is another nice Q-sac game. Kavalek ( then-Czechoslovakia ) played black against Fernandez ( Columbia ). It was played in the preliminaries of the Chess Olympiad in Tel Aviv, in November 1964.
