**Scarborough Fields 2 Teams in New GTCL Club League**

After an absence of too many years, club team play has returned to the GTA. The clubs participating submitted a list of potential team players, and thereafter the captains make up the team for a particular match from this list, subject to a number of conditions, such as : the top three rated players in the pool must play only on the first team; players shall be listed according to their rating, but players on adjacent boards may switch boards, etc. The game time limit is Sudden Death/ 90 Minutes.

There are 8 teams in the league. The following clubs have each fielded one team : Toronto Macedonian CC; Brampton CC; High Park CC; Mississauga Polonia CC. Dutton CC and ourselves have each fielded 2 teams.

Scarborough has submitted a list of 10 players : Bryan LAMB – 2190; Andrija DESPOTOVIC – 2047; Allan CAI – 1996; Andrew PICANA – 1988; Andre ROLAVS – 1935; Jack TRIEFELDT – 1902; Bob ARMSTRONG – 1859; Gaja SRINIVASAN – 1507; Ted TERMEER – 1463; Liam HENRY – 1306. If you are interested in playing, speak to Bryan who is team captain for both teams.

SCC's first match was on Tues. Oct. 17. It was held at SCC since, amazingly enough, the first match for SCC “ A “, and SCC “ B “, was against each other !! Bryan's choice of teams for this match was :

“ B “ – 1. ROLAVS; 2. TRIEFELDT; 3. SRINIVASAN; 4. TERMEER

Despite some excellent play by the B team players, the A team swept the match 4-0.

The next match for SCC “ A “ is on Tuesday, Nov. 7 against Mississauga Polonia CC. The next match for SCC “ B “ is on Tues. Nov. 14, against the Toronto Macedonian CC ( we'll likely be facing some of our own “ dual – membership “ members !! ).

Anand about his game, playing white, against I. Sokolov, in the 1996 Wijk Aan Zee category XVII tournament ( Ruy Lopez : Anti-Marshall – C88 ) :
