Kramnik Leading Deep Fritz

The “ Brains in Bahrain “ match between classical World Champion, Vladimir Kramnik (Russia), and last year’s Computer Chess Program Champion, Deep Fritz, has gone 5 games so far. It has been played October 4, 6, 8, 10 and 13. The program is one developed by the German company, ChessBase, and is running on a multi-processor. The prize fund is \$ 1 million. It goes for 8 games.

Kramnik leads 3 : 2, having won 2 (Games 2 & 3), drawn 2 (Games 1 & 4) and lost 1 (Game 5). In a difficult situation in Game 5, and in time trouble, Kramnik made one of the worst blunders of his career, and dropped a piece. Until Game 5, there was a general opinion building that the computer simply couldn’t match Kramnik’s superlative endgame technique, and that he would walk away with the match. But Game 5 is a wake-up call, that D.F. is not to be counted out yet.

2003 Canadian Youth Chess Championships

Next year the CYCC and the Canadian Open will be in Ontario, in Kapuskasing. A strong organizing committee has been working on this, initially in preparing the bid, and once accepted, working to put the details in place. They have gotten the full cooperation of the city of Kapuskasing, and the city has guaranteed a large part of the Canadian Open prize fund. They have also initiated a drive to try to get the federal government to provide a travel grant to the CYCC Provincial Champions and the 2 runners – up, to help them get to the nationals next year. This requires some political lobbying, to try to get the grant to be provided. Below is the posting from October 4 on ChessTalk by one of the organizers, asking for the help of all chess players across Canada. To assist the organizing committee further, SCTCN&V agreed to help spotlight the type of help needed :

To all those interested in raising the profile of chess in Canada:

We need help in a lobbying effort to obtain a federal subsidy for the top three provincial qualifiers of each age category (3 girls and 3 boys). We have initiated contacts at the Federal level since last February - it looks good but extra support will help. What we need is letters of support from Federal Members of Parliament - lots of them (30 or more) and to get these, there has to be contacts made to various MPs across the country. To have an impact before the budget, those letters should be ready before the end of October 2002.
