(1910.02.19 – 1990.12.30)

Born Budapest, Hungary

Hungarian Champion 1941

Hungarian Correspondence Champion 1942-44

Arrived Canada 1953

International Master 1969

Represented Canada at Olympiads (1958, 1970)

Represented Canada at World Championship Interzonal 1958

2nd place Canadian Championship 1957, 1959

3rd place Canadian Championship 1969

Played Canadian Championship 1955, 1961, 1963, 1972

Canadian Speed Champion 1955

Here is a game Fuster played in the 1941 Hungarian Championship. I believe it's not available in the popular databases, but even if it is, I hope you take the time to play through it. Geza gives a lesson in tactics: a desperado on move 18; and a sacrifice to set up a skewer that ends the game.

March Madness Weekend Swiss, Toronto, Ontario

40 players showed up at Tartu College for this GTCL – sponsored event. GTCL has rented the Tartu College space once a month to December (except August), and is currently negotiating with organizers who will use the space. Also, there is a new “ Lotto Bonus “ feature introduced into this series, whereby an additional prize is available if a section winner wins all 5 games. If this doesn’t happen, then the uncollected prizes are added to the bonus prizes in the next tournament. Over the course of a number of tournaments, this bonus prize could amount to a large sum.

The Open section was won by Evgeni Miller. Tied for second were Jura Ochkoos and Charlie Tang. The U 2200 section was won by Hazel Smith. The U 2000 section was shared by Craig Thorvardson and Geordie Derraugh . The U 1800 section was shared by Tyler Longo, Alex Martchenko and Conrad Ho. The U 1600 prize was won by Alfonso Cheng. He was the only winner to win all 5 games, and he picked up that sections “ Lotto Bonus “ of \$ 150, in addition to the \$ 100 first prize for the section.

Chris Takov headed the under 1980 class (3.5). Maurice Smith and Andrew Kaniak shared under 1800 at 2.5. Oswald Barmasch won the under 1600 (2.5) and also won the Amateur trophy (under 1700) on tiebreaks.
