2004 Women’s World Championship

This month the Women’s World Championship knockout concluded in Elista, Kalmykia, Russia. The winner was top Bulgarian WGM Antoaneta Stefanova, over her Russian finalist opponent, Ekaterina Kovalevskaya. Stefanova won the first two games, and then drew a hard-fought third game to win the title.

Prague Unity Agreement Criticism

As you are aware, Garry Kasparov (Russia), 13th FIDE World Champion, and highest rated player in the world, is set to play the winner of the FIDE 2004 knockout world championship. Also, Vladimir Kramnik (Russia), current Classical World Champion, and third highest rated player, will later this year play Peter Leko (Hungary) for the Classical Championship. The plan then calls for a title reunification match between the two winners.

Last Issue, we presented alternative formats put forward by Kasparov, Yasser Serawan, USA grandmaster, and one of the architects of the Agreement, and Ruslan Ponomariov, 2002 FIDE World Champion.

We asked what you thought of the present format, and of the alternative formats put forward. Maurice Smith, CFC FIDE representative, and SCC member, responded. Here are his comments :

“ I believe the format for the unification of the World Championship should remain the same. The present format is workable although not everyone is

happy with it. However if is changed again for the umpteenth time, no matter what the format would be, there will still be some people unhappy. Indeed if Ruslan Ponomariov had agreed to play Gary Kasparov some time ago none of this would have been necessary. FIDE bent over backwards to please Ponomariov but it seemed he did not want to face Kasparov no matter what.

Although FIDE gets criticized continually from some people and quite often deservedly so, this time I think they are doing everything they can to unify the chess world and please as many people as possible. Therefore I do not think anyone should try and change the format again. Just let's get on with it.”

Some notable results: FMs Quan and Krnan each scored 5.5/6 for the juniors; and there was not one draw in the first five rounds!
