

SCHOOL'S OUT--- Let's Play Chess on July 1 (Note date change)

On July 1 there will be a tournament for youth born between July 2, 1985 and July 2, 1991. The tournament is being conducted as a volunteer by Martin Jaeger, an International Arbiter and a former president of the Chess Federation of Canada. The purpose of the tournament is to provide enjoyment, introduce players to the Chess Federation of Canada and appropriate comportment at tournaments, and to provide players the experience of acting autonomously at tournaments without the presence of parents. There will be no same-day or phone entries.

All entries must be sent by mail (postmarked by June 24) . Entry will be by a cheque for \$7 payable to Martin Jaeger. \$20 charge for a returned cheque.

The tournament will be held at Tartu College (one block east of Spadina on the north side of Bloor.) Only players will be allowed in the tournament area. (Parents can communicate with players via a bulletin board.) It will be a so-called Active Tournament (each player will have 30 minutes on a clock to complete the game.) The tournament will be rated by the Chess Federation of Canada. Membership in the CFC is not required.

The tournament will be conducted in three sections by age group (16,17; 14,15; 12,13.) There will be four rounds—11:am, 1, 2:15 and 3:30. There will be a players meeting at 10:30 am and all players are expected to attend. Winners (tie breaks (not playoffs) will be used if needed to break ties) of each section will receive an embroidered cap as a prize. All players receiving the winning number of points will be awarded a CFC Junior Participating Membership. The tournament director/organiser is acting as a volunteer and any surplus generated by the tournament will be donated to the CFC to support travel by the Canadian junior team.

All players are to bring a board, a chess set and a chess clock. (Chess clocks are available from the CFC or in Toronto at the Chess Shop 1681 Bayview Ave.) Players without a clock will be assessed a supplementary \$5 fee at the board. All funds so collected will be used to finance a raffle for (a) chess clock(s) among players paying the fee.
