WORLD CADET

The World Cadet (Under 16) Chess Championship was held in Timisoara, Romania from July 24 to August 7. Canadian representative Alexandre Lesiège of Longueuil, Québec put in a tremendous performance, finishing 10th with 6.5/11. Lesiège, who only turned 13 in mid-August, started off remarkably well and was in 4th spot after the eighth round, in which he defeated the pre-tournament favourite, eventual 2nd place finisher Ilya Gurevich of the United States. A loss to England's newest prodigy, Matthew Sadler, in the ninth round, followed by a draw and a tough final round loss pushed him down to 10th. As the youngest serious contender, and

considering the strength of his opposition, his result can be described as nothing short of amazing.

Lesiège's future is promising. With a current CFC rating of 2300+, he will be a real threat in next year's Canadian Junior, not to mention the Cadet Championship. Here is a fine attacking game from Timisoara:

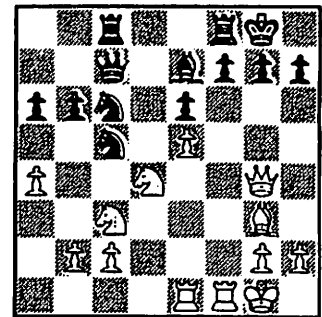

CANADIAN OPEN

The 1988 Canadian Open in Scarborough was a well-run affair with a total of 206 participants. Thirteen of these were masters, and an additional thirty-five players were rated over 2000. The top section was won by IM Lawrence Day of Toronto with 8.5 points out of 10, a mere half point ahead of a logjam of masters on 8 including Roman Pelts, Bryon Nickoloff, Vinny Puri, and Kevin Pacey. Day won \$1000 for his efforts, while the players with 8 received \$450 each. Hans Jung also scored 8 points, but took home \$700 as the top Candidate Master.

A further report is forthcoming in EP 92. The following ninth round game between Bailey and Day was crucial to the final results and well illustrates the tournament winner's provocative style:

ACTIVE CHESS

Active chess (30 minutes per player per game) is here to stay according to FIDE, the World Chess Federation. From a recent FIDE press release:

"The first Active Chess World Championship cycle got off to a rousing start with highly successful Continental Championships in Europe, Asia and the Americas.

The Continental Championships are the first phase of the year-long cycle. Forty-five qualifiers from Europe, 30 from the Americas, 15 from Asia and 10 from Africa shall then meet in the 13-round Swiss system Intercontinental tournament. Survivors advance to a series of knockout matches – quarterfinals, semifinals and world championship. The Intercontinental and championship matches are to be held as one event for a Wimbledon-style impact. [Note: the Intercontinental and World Active Chess Championships are scheduled to be held in Mazatlan, Mexico, from December 10-17. The regulations governing the combined event will be settled at the FIDE Congress, which is being held alongside the Chess Olympiad in Greece.]

The European continental was held 31 May to 4 June in Gijon, Spain with 109 players from 25 countries vying for some 100,000 Swiss Francs in cash prizes. Over 250 joined the American Continental, 29-30 June in Philadelphia, which determined 20 of the 30 allotted to the Americas. The remaining 10 players will come from Latin America. In Asia, 68 players from 13 countries saw action in the Asian Continental, 16-20 June in Singapore. The African continental is being arranged.

Other sports have adapted to the modern age. Television has influenced the way many sports are played and scored - for example, the sudden-death system in tennis. These changes have brought bigger prize funds for televised sports and financial incentives for the players.

The main aim of FIDE is the diffusion and development of chess among all nations of the world. And today, with the tempo of life steadily increasing, chess has to meet the needs of the changing times. Now, with computers and chess databases, players have better facilities for study. Mass participation, spectator appeal and mass media exposure are called for. From today's 8 million registered players, we could see chess flourish to 20 or more million registrants, mainly due to Active Chess."

The top finishers from the continentals were: Rogelio Antonio Jr. (Philippines) and Utut Adianto (Indonesia), Lev Alburt and Michael Wilder (both USA), and Anatoly Karpov and Vladimir Tukmakov (both USSR). The only Canadian to qualify was Igor Ivanov, who finished 6th in Philadelphia.

Canada has not made a firm decision as to

how it will handle the expected surge of popularity in Active Chess. The Chess Federation of Canada, as a nation-member of FIDE, is currently examining the question of how to deal with Active Chess.

SHORT - SPEELMAN

The Candidate's Quarter-final match between Britain's two leading GMs, Nigel Short and Jonathan Speelman, began August 17th in London, England. The match of six games started with two well-fought draws, but Speelman pulled out all the stops in the next two games, and now has an almost insurmountable lead of 3-1. The winner will gain £12,500 (5/8 of the prize fund) and a place in the Semi-finals of the World Championship.

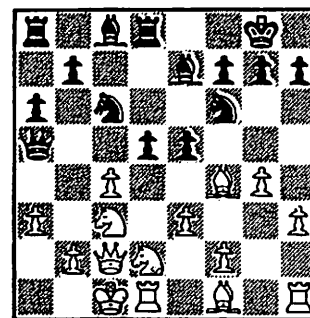

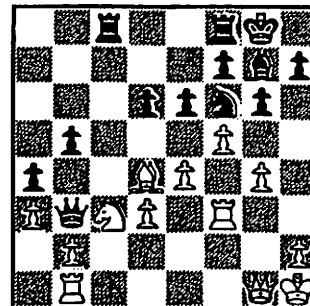

U.S. OPEN

The 1988 U.S. Open was held in Boston, Massachusetts and attracted a field of 632 players. American GM Dmitri Gurevich won the event outright with 10/12. Only a handful of Canadians were playing, but IM Bryon Nickoloff of Toronto had an excellent result, finishing in a tie for second with GMs Michael Rohde and Larry Christiansen of the US.

USSR CHAMPIONSHIP

Gary Kasparov and Anatoly Karpov tied for first with 11.5/17 in a super-strong Soviet Championship. They are to play a four-game match to determine a clear winner, as in the Beliavsky - Salov tiebreak of last year. Karpov apparently does not want to play this match on

the grounds that the ruling in the event of a 2-2 tie is unsatisfactory. Indeed, a 2-2 tie is to be broken by the first subsequent decisive game, and we all know what happened in the "Moscow Marathon" of 1985...

CANADIAN OLYMPIC CHESS TEAM

At the Annual Meeting in Scarborough, the Governors of the Chess Federation of Canada decided to appoint Dr. Nathan Divinsky (Canada's FIDE Representative) to the position of team captain for both the National Team and the Ladies Team. Since Dr. Divinsky is not in a position to act as a substitute on the National Team in the event that two of the regular team members were unable to play, the Governors decided that a full six player National Team should be sent. (The team that was sent to the previous Chess Olympics in Dubai had only five players: the four regular boards, and one alternate. Team Captain Denis Allan was officially the second alternate, but he was to play only in an "emergency". He wound up playing one game.)

Most of the top eligible players have stated that they are willing to play on Canada's Olympic Team. Dr. Divinsky is still hoping to convince Mr. Spraggett to play. Mr. Spraggett is immersed in his preparations to meet Mr. Yusupov in the World Championship Quarter-Final match scheduled for Montréal in January, and it seems unlikely that he will take three weeks off to participate. Céline Roos has been out of the country for some time, but should be returning shortly. The ultimate team composition will depend on final decisions by

these two players. If both decline to play, the lineup (in board order, as determined by their ratings in the July/August issue of *En Passant*, and barring last minute withdrawals) will be as follows:

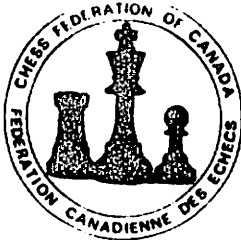
