## NEWS

### Candidates Matches

Grandmaster Kevin Spraggett of Montreal got off to a flying start in the first weekend of his World Championship Quarterfinal match against Artur Yusupov of the Soviet Union. He drew the first game with the Black pieces, and scored a fine win in game two with White to take an early lead in the six-game contest.

Yusupov, considered the heavy favourite by most, appeared visibly shaken after his loss in the second game. In the third game, however, Yusupov converted a theoretically minuscule advantage into a beautiful positional win. There followed three relatively cautious draws to level

the match 3-3 and send it into overtime. The two remaining overtime games were much like games four through six.

Canadians were hoping for a repeat of Saint John, where Spraggett defeated Soviet GM Andrei Sokolov last February in sudden death overtime, but this time the roulette wheel landed on black: Spraggett lost the first sudden-death playoff game (with a 1 hour time control), and the match went to Yusupov, 5-4.

The match was well covered by the media, and made appearances in many of the major Eastern newspapers, particularly in Québec and on both the CBC and CTV National News. Spraggett was disappointed with his loss but remained in a good humour for the press conference immediately following the final game. The two players had a mutual respect for each other and Yusupov praised Spraggett's international progress, saying that he felt "Mr. Spraggett is in the top ten best players in the world". Yusupov was ranked third behind World Champion Gary Kasparov and challenger Anatoly Karpov several years ago, but has not been in his best form since losing a match to compatriot Andrei Sokolov in the last World Championship cycle. He has been consistently high in the World ranking list (FIDE) and his comments about the evenness of the match and the level of Spraggett's play is high praise indeed. The prize fund of \$50,000 was split evenly due to the tie after six games.

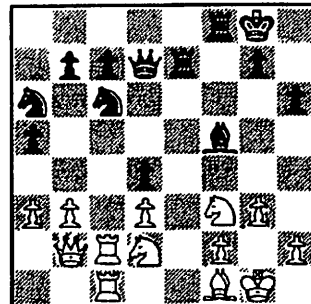

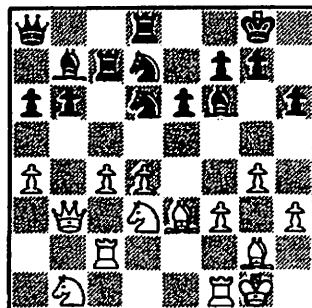

In the remaining Candidates' Quarterfinal matches, GMs Lajos Portisch (Hungary) and Jan Timman (Netherlands) were even after five games in Antwerp, Belgium and Challenger Anatoly Karpov (USSR) won 3.5-1.5 against Johann Hjartarson (Iceland) in Seattle, USA.

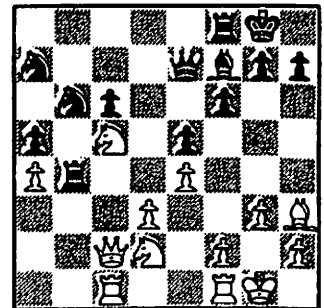
In the Portisch-Timman match, the first game ended in a draw after more than 100 moves in a gruelling Q ending. Portisch must have been relieved to hang on as Timman failed to convert an outside passed P to a full point. Portisch escaped again in the second game when Timman built up a commanding position against the Caro-Kann, only to allow a perpetual check during the time scramble. The third game went to Portisch and things looked bleak for the Dutchman, but Timman levelled the match for the potential showdown of game six.

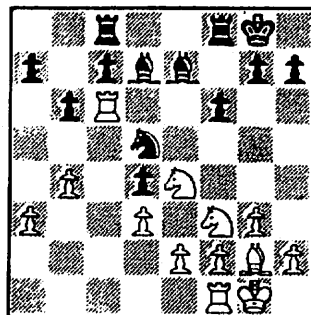

**Women's World Championship**

Maya Chiburdanidze, 27, of Soviet Georgia, retained her Women's World Championship title for the 5th time by defeating compatriot Nana Ioseliani 8.5-7.5 in a hard-fought match in Telavi, USSR. Women's chess has been dominated by the Soviet Union: all of the competitors in the world championship matches have been Soviet citizens since World War II. In addition, the Soviet Women's team had finished first in every Olympiad they participated in up until Thessaloniki 1988, when the young Hungarian team made history by snatching first place by half a point in the last round. In all fairness, however, Elena Akhmilovskaya's defection and marriage to U.S. Men's Captain, John Donaldson, must have made things very difficult for the Soviets.

The following game was a key one for Chiburdanidze, as it gave her a lead which she never relinquished:

**GMA-JAT Open**

The strongest Open tournament in chess history, the GMA-JAT Open, was organized by the Grandmaster's Association and was sponsored by JAT (Yugoslavian Airlines) in Belgrade in December. A record breaking 100 GMs, including 4 WGMs, competed in the 258-player event for the US\$100,000 prize fund. In addition to the horde of GMs, there were 78 IMs, 69 Soviet players in total and 25 nations represented overall.

It was the first qualification event to the GMA World Cup Open in 1990. Eight players qualified from Belgrade. Two other qualification events, possibly the 1989 New York Open and a similar event in Moscow, will provide the remaining 16 participants. From these 24, half will proceed directly to the 1991-92 World Cup cycle.

The "lucky eight" from Belgrade were headed by GM Krunoslav Hulak (YUG) who won his first six games and eventually finished with 7/9. Also with seven were five Soviets: Igor Naumkin (IM only!), Lev Psakhis, Mikhail Gurevich, Evgeny Pigusov, and Lev Polugaevsky. They won \$8,833 each.

The last two qualifiers, Gennadi Timoschenko and Evgeny Bareev (both USSR), led the pack of nine on 6.5 points: Margeir Petursson (ICE), Evgeny Sveshnikov, L.Dzhanzhava, Igor Dorfman (all USSR), Goran Dizdar (YUG), Helgi Olafsson (ISD) and Michael Wilder (USA). Each won \$2,333. The tie for 16-46th places was worth \$838.

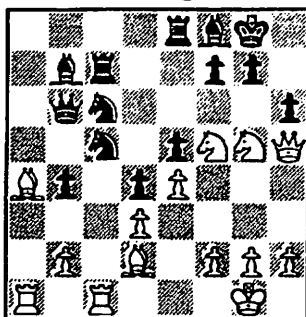

## Changes: Laws of Chess

FIDE has introduced some changes in the laws of chess, which now apply to Canadian tournaments.

Article 5.6(e): The first two sentences have been replaced by the following: "In a competition if a new piece required for the promotion is not immediately available, the player may stop his clock to ask for the assistance of the arbiter."

Article 6.5 has been modified by adding one more exception: "This applies to all situations except those governed by Articles 10.1, 10.2, 10.3, 10.4 and 10.7."

Article 8.5 is now split into new Articles 8.5 and 8.6. The old Article 8.6 is now Article 8.7.

Article 8.5: "If, during a game, it is found that the initial position of the pieces was incorrect, the game shall be annulled and a new game played."

Article 8.6: "If a game has begun with colours incorrectly reversed then it shall continue if one quarter of the time allocated to the first time control has elapsed. Earlier the arbiter can arrange a new game to start with the correct colours, if the event's time-table is not excessively disrupted."

Article 10.5 now reads: "The game is drawn, upon a claim by the player having the move, when the same position, for the third time:

- is about to appear if he first declares to the arbiter his intention of making this move, and writes this move on his scoresheet; or
- has just appeared, the same player having the move each time. The position is considered the same if pieces of the same kind and colour occupy the same squares and if the possible moves of all the pieces are the same, including the right to castle or to take a pawn en passant."

Article 10.7 now reads: "The game is drawn when one of the following endings arises:

- king against king,
- king against king with only bishop or knight,
- king and bishop against king and bishop, with both bishops on diagonals of the same colour.

A player having a bare king cannot win the game. A draw shall be declared if the opponent of a player with a bare king oversteps the time (Article 10.11/10.12) or has sealed an illegal move."

Article 10.9 has been substantially revised: The number of 50 moves mentioned in Article 10.8 will be extended to 75 moves for the following positions:

- king, rook and bishop against king and rook.
- king and two knights against king and pawn.
- king, queen and a pawn one square from promoting against king and queen.
- king and queen against king and two knights.
- king and queen against king and two bishops.
- king and two bishops against king and knight."

Article 10.11.1 and 10.11.2 have been deleted (they are now included under Article 10.5). Articles 10.12 through 10.16 have been renumbered to Article 10.11 through 10.15. The new Article 10.11 reads as follows: "If a player claims a draw under the provisions of Article 10.5 and/or 10.8, the arbiter must first stop the clocks while the claim is being investigated. In the absence of the arbiter the player may stop both clocks to seek the arbiter's assistance.

- (a) If the claim is found to be correct, the game is drawn.
- (b) If the claim is found to be incorrect, the arbiter shall then add five minutes to the claimant's used time. If this means that the claimant has overstepped the time limit, his game will be declared lost. Otherwise the game will be continued and the player who has indicated a move according to Articles 10.5 and/or 10.8 is obliged to execute this move on the chessboard.
- (c) A player who has made a claim under this article cannot withdraw the claim."

Article 10.12: "The game is lost by the player who has not completed the prescribed number of moves in the allotted time, unless his opponent has only the king remaining, in which case the game is drawn."

Article 10.13 (c): "the player present at the chessboard has lost the game according to Article 10.12 by exceeding his time limit."

Article 11.3: "If both players cannot keep score, the arbiter, or his deputy, must endeavour to be present and keep score. The arbiter must not intervene unless one flag falls, and until then he should not indicate in any manner to the players how many moves have been made."

Article 11.4: "If article 11.2 does not apply, and a player refuses to record the game according to Article 11.1, then Article 10.15 should be applied."

Article 12.5: "If the game needs to be interrupted for some reason for which neither player is responsible, the clocks shall be stopped by the arbiter. This should be done, for example, in the case of an illegal position being corrected, in the case of a defective clock being changed, or if the piece which a player has declared he

wishes to exchange for a promoted pawn is not immediately available or to claim a draw by repetitions of position, or under the 50 moves rules. If the arbiter is not present, the player may stop both clocks in order to seek the arbiter's assistance."

Article 12.6 has been modified by adding the following paragraph: "This rule must not be used to leave a player with less than five minutes to the control, or less than one minute for every move to the time control. (The most common occasion when this problem arises is immediately after an adjournment when the clock times can be most easily adjusted using the times on the sealed move envelope.)"

Article 12.7: "A resignation or an agreement to draw (Articles 10.2 and 10.4) remains valid even when it is found later that the flag has fallen."

Article 12.8: "If both flags have fallen virtually at the same time and the arbiter is unable to establish clearly which flag fell first, the game shall continue. In this case, the next move played will be considered to be the first one of the following time control."

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Please be sure to add up the player's scores and include them in the crosstable. It shouldn't take too much time.

Including the names of the tournament organizer, the reporter and the TD on the crosstable will enable us to properly acknowledge those who put in the time and effort to make the tournament a success.
